APPLICATION FEE (Nonrefundable)

\$50 nonrefundable processing fee charged for the 1st application as long as the student remains in campus housing for consecutive semesters.

\$100 damage deposit refundable upon contract period end and proper check out from the hall.

HOUSING INFORMATION

APPLICATION PROCESS

Applications must be submitted with the appropriate fees. Assignments are made for an academic year; therefore, those students attending school for the Fall semester will have the same room assignment in the Spring when applicable. When requesting a residence hall assignment, consider the characteristics of each hall. If requesting a private room, indicate so on the application and submit the appropriate fees.

ASSIGNMENTS

Residence hall assignments are based on the date the deposit and prepayment are received in the Housing Office. Residence hall and roommate preferences may be indicated on the application, and when possible, these preferences will be granted if both parties have applied before the deadline and have made the necessary deposit and prepayments. Freshmen requesting Baker-Huger or Conference Center must first be accepted into the Honors Program. For more information, call (337) 482-6700.

PAYMENTS

Failure to complete payments according to the payment plan selected may result in cancellation of meal ticket, holds placed on student's account and possible eviction from residence halls with no reduction in charges. A late fee of \$10.00 will be assessed for all payments made after each payment due dates.

MEAL PLAN OPTIONS

7DB	7 meals a week in the cafeteria and \$425 declining balance
10DB	10 meals a week in the cafeteria and \$225 declining balance
15DB	3 meals a day (Monday - Friday) in the cafeteria and \$100 declining balance

◆ Declining balance is the credit amount to be used either in the Cafeteria, Sidelines, Cypress Lake Café, The Food Court or Fleur de lis Café

SEMESTER PERIODS

Semesters for housing purposes shall be defined as the period beginning with the first day of classes for an individual semester and ending at 12 noon on the day after regularly scheduled finals for that semester. The period covered by room and board charges shall be for the semester indicated on the application and shall not include any break periods.

SEMESTER BREAKS

Periods between semesters are called breaks. Limited housing without meals may be offered for the breaks between semesters. Break halls are Bonin, Baker-Huger and Harris for females and Stokes and Conference Center for males. Therefore, students interested in such housing should try to live in one of the break halls. Students must apply for break housing at the Housing Office and pay \$175.00 **prior to the day** before the first day of finals for the semester immediately preceding the break requested.

STORAGE

Students will be allowed to leave belongings in their closet between Fall and Spring for a \$75.00 storage fee provided they meet the following stipulations: were residents during the preceding semester **and** are registered for classes for the following semester/session **and** are returning to the same room for the following semester/session. Failure to return to the residence hall by the second day of check-in for the following semester will result in an additional storage fee of \$20.00 per day. The University will dispose of abandoned items 48 hours after the end of the contract period.

ROOMMATES

Students who wish to room together in the residence hall should submit their housing application together and request each other as roommates. Every effort will be made to honor roommate requests. Be sure that each person meets the requirements of the requested hall.

RESIDENCE HALLS

UL Lafayette has 8 residence halls. Each hall has reception areas, microwaves, computer rooms and study rooms. UL Lafayette's residence halls are equipped with twin-size beds, mini-blinds, desks, closets, local telephone service including voice-mail service, and cable television service. Students must provide their own telephone and television. Only touch-tone telephones can access the voice-mail system. **All Residence halls are smoke-free facilities.**

LEGACY PARK APARTMENTS

UL Lafayette has 8 apartment buildings. Each apartment includes: furniture, on campus gated parking, paid utilities, phone line with voicemail, washer and dryer, high speed internet and extended cable in each bedroom and living room, choice of meal plan and 24-hour emergency maintenance.

REGULATIONS

Residents of housing on the UL Lafayette campus are subject to the stipulations of the housing application sheet, room and board rate sheet, residence hall handbook, and code of student conduct.
